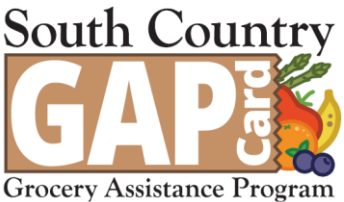


Supplemental Benefits for 2025 for SeniorCare Complete and AbilityCare

Our Benefit	Benefit Description
Grocery Assistance Program (GAP) Card 	New! SeniorCare Complete members will receive a \$130 grocery card per quarter, which equals \$520 annually. New! AbilityCare members will receive a \$210 grocery card per quarter, which equals \$840 annually.
Be Active! Exercise Program 	SeniorCare Complete and AbilityCare members receive \$40 off monthly health club memberships. No “max number of visits” to receive discount.
Post Discharge Home Delivered Meals 	Within 7 days of member discharge from inpatient hospitalization, including observation stay, swing bed or skilled rehab stay in a nursing facility (excludes same-day surgery). Mom’s Meals delivered up to 170 meals, 2 times a day for up to 85 days after discharge for SeniorCare Complete, and up to 178 meals, 2 times a day for up to 89 days for AbilityCare. Eligible members on waiver (DSD or EW) are eligible only if their waiver services have reached a budget cap.
Dental Crown 	South Country will pay for 1 dental porcelain crown annually upon medical necessity.

Eyewear Lens Upgrade 	South Country will pay any combination up to \$148.80 per year, up to 2 lenses: anti-glare coating, photochromatic lens tinting, and progressive lenses.
Personal Emergency Response System (PERS) 	Provider is MedScope (only). Eligible members include non-waivered, or for those on EW (only if their waiver services have reached the budget cap). Check the box on the benefit request form to indicate waiver cap (when applicable.) No annual maximum.
Home and Safety Modifications 	Home and safety devices or modifications covered include: devices, equipment or modifications that promote safe independent living such as: grab bars, shower or bathtub seats, handrails, non-slip flooring, temporary wheelchair ramps, and lift chairs, etc. (max \$1,000 year). *This benefit only covers items not covered by waiver services.

Other Notes:

* The nurse line will still be available to members.

** In 2025 there will be a \$0 co-pay for Part D drugs.
